e-books at Branigan Library



Branigan Library is expanding its e-services. A new service called 3M Cloud has been introduced offering readers a new way to remotely access e-books. Library staff is familiarizing patrons with the new service at Branigan Memorial Library, but those who are a little more familiar with e-services can go to their device's app store and download 3M

Cloud Library. The service is compatible with several eReaders including Nook, Kobo, Kindle Android and IOS devices. Four books can be downloaded at a time for a three week period at which time the e-book will disappear from the app and be returned to the e-book library. Patrons do have the ability to check the book in early to allow others to use the e-book sooner. Multiple copies of the book are not available. Users must have a library ID to use the service. Readers can also place holds on books until they become available for download. 528-4000



Water Waste Hotline If you see water being wasted, report it anonymously! Call the new easy-to-remember Water Waste Hotline at 528-4444. Summer watering restrictions are in effect now through September 30. Outdoor watering is allowed only before 10 a.m. and after 6 p.m. on the following days:

- Odd addresses: Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday
- Even addresses: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday
- Outdoor watering is never allowed on Monday

The South Central Solid Waste Authority (SCSWA) is accepting glass bottles and jars for recycling and crushing. By the end of the summer, an industrial sized glass pulverizer should be installed and crushing glass. Glass "cullet" will be given back to the community in blue, green, clear and amber colors. 528-3800

Las Cruces Utilities is very careful about getting rid of cockroaches in manholes, without adding chemicals to the wastewater system. Instead of spraying poisons, the Water Resources Section "dusts" manholes with Borax – that old, familiar mineral and salt used commonly in the U.S. for more than a century. 528-3511



Water Harvesting



The City of Las Cruces is saving water and beautifying its parks with the help of Groundwork Doña Ana – the group credited with planting 500 trees last summer in different locations throughout the city. This year, a team of more than a dozen is landscaping different parks with rock and adaptive plants and placing them in a hilly environment they are creating to capture available water. The process is called water harvesting. A few parks along Spruce Avenue have already been completed. 541-2550

The City of Las Cruces is a Home Rule municipality with a council-manager form of government with policies set by the City Council. The city manager is the chief executive officer, responsible for offering leadership and guidance to all departments. The manager is also charged with ensuring cost effective, day-to-day operations of programs and services provided by the organization. The assistant city managers support the city manager in the daily administration, decision-making, and guidance of City staff, and represents the city manager in his absence.

The Community Liaison serves residents directly and supports all City departments with developing strong neighborhood and community relationships. This is accomplished through coordination with the City Council, city manager and assistant city managers regarding constituent issues and communication to increase knowledge, awareness, and outreach about City services, programs and policies. The work of the community liaison is directly related to strengthening our City's quality of life through community participation, resident involvement in neighborhood and community organizations and supporting clearly defined links between the City, City services and neighborhood and community organizations. The Community Liaison's office also is responsible for managing Ask the City,

which is a 311 service www.askthecity.org that residents may use on the City's web-site at www.las-cruces.org to report any issues or concerns – from potholes and street lights and many other items, to how to find information or make suggestions.

Internal Audit provides audits and consulting services to promote transparency, accountability, efficiency, and effectiveness of City government for the citizens of Las Cruces.

Risk Management manages risk for the City and taxpayers and promotes employee safety. The office also ensures recovery of damages to City assets caused by individuals and outside agencies.

The Public Information Office (PIO) helps educate the public about City Council actions and City services, programs and activities. PIO supports the City's missions and strategic directions through internal and external communications such as advertising and marketing.
