

RV Ordinance FAQs

1. What is a recreational vehicle?

A recreational vehicle is defined as a vehicle with a camping body that has its own motive power, is affixed to or is drawn by another vehicle and includes motor homes, travel trailers and truck campers.

2. Why is the ordinance changing?

To add clarity to the ordinance and make it more enforceable.

3. When can you park RV on a residential street?

You can park an RV on a residential street with a permit for up to 6 consecutive days, with a maximum of 18 days in a 90-day period.

4. Where can I get a permit?

You can obtain a permit at the following locations:

- Las Cruces City Hall permit county in Community Development
700 North Main Street
- East Mesa Public Safety Complex
550 North Sonoma Ranch Blvd

5. What information is needed to obtain a permit?

- Name (registered owner of vehicle)
- Address where vehicle will be parked
- Email address
- Telephone number
- License plate number
- Vehicle make, model and year
- Beginning and ending effective date of permit
- Vehicle registration

6. How much does a permit cost?

Permits are free
